


IF-15 Deadheading Roses

- 1. Cut at the first five-leaflet leaf on the cane.
- 2. Cut at an angle similar to the angle of the leaf stem.
- 3. Cut at a point where the cane is strong enough to hold new growth.
- 4. If you have to cut so low as to cut off too many leaves or too much cane, only cut to the lowest threeleaflet leaf on the cane.
