

DECEMBER TIMELY TIPS

Tree fir all

Before bringing your tree inside, make a fresh cut to the stump, about 2 inches. Apply wilt-pruf for longer lasting needles.

When choosing a Christmas tree, select one with firm needles that don't drop off when the tree is raised up a few inches and dropped to the ground. The bottom of the stump should be moist with some sap present.



X-MAS TREE RECYCLING

Allow any ice that accumulates on tree branches to melt naturally. Cracking ice with heavy objects or hot water should be avoided.

Don't break the ice.

SNOW-VER LOAD

Remove heavy snow loads from evergreen branches by gently sweeping snow off with a broom. If branches have been anchored to the ground, gently lift them from underneath with a broom. Be gentle, avoid beating, whacking or excessive shaking.



Water during thaw or when there has been no precipitation for 3 weeks. Container plants should be watered after 2 weeks of no precipitation.



Avoid fertilizing non-blooming houseplants until March.



MULCH PERENNIAL BEDS & ROSES NOW IF YOU HAVEN'T DONE SO WITH 2 TO 4 INCHES OF G&B ORGANICS SOIL BUILDING CONDITIONER.



Avoid walking on frozen lawns; it can cause damage that may not be repaired until spring.



Be sure all leaves and twigs are removed from your lawn before our next snowfall.

MONITOR HOUSEPLANTS FOR INSECT PROBLEMS THAT OFTEN OCCUR WHEN PLANTS BECOME STRESSED DUE TO INSUFFICIENT LIGHT, OVERHEATED ROOMS OR IMPROPER WATERING AND FERTILIZING TECHNIQUES.



Decorative foil on holiday plants blocks drainage which leads to pooling & root rot. Remove foils or wraps from all holiday plants, or punch holes in the foil to allow water to drain.
